Catchments, Corridors and Coasts January 17th – 19th 2018

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Snorkelling in the ocean, walking in the bush, getting up close and personal with native fauna, sharing experiences with environmental educators – these are just some of the activities you can expect when you participate in the action packed Catchments, Corridors and Coasts (CCC) Program.

CCC provides a ‘snapshot’ of environmental education in WA from catchments, through corridors to the coast. It provides a rich experience, facilitating the development of networks with and between practitioners, and an awareness of the resources and support across WA to help address core environmental and sustainability issues in the State. Learn about environmental issues, what is being done by community groups and various levels of government, what resources are available and how we can all work together for a better environment.

It is a practical program, which focuses on learning through experience and skill development, while also reflecting the synergies between the environmental education practitioners in WA. CCC will provide a wealth of take home resources, which will form a toolkit for participants to use in their own workplace. All of the program content can be linked to the current Western Australian curriculum, along with links to the Australian Curriculum. This event practises low-waste initiatives.

Who Should Attend?

The program is suitable for tertiary students or new graduates; community members & groups; youth organisations; teachers; student teachers; Sustainable Schools WA participants; private sector personnel, Environmental Officers; Local Government Officers; and State Government Department Officers.

You will gain: resources, practical experience, networking, skills and knowledge, learn some new fun activities with links to the curriculum, links to practitioners, toolkit for teaching and learning, or for environmental education as a management tool.
